for example.

- **If I won** the lottery, **I would** buy a big house.

(I probably won't win the lottery)

- **If I met** the Prime minister, **I would** say hello.

- She **would** travel all over the world **if** she **were** rich.

- She **would** pass the exam **if** she ever **studied**.

(She never studies, so this won't happen)

Second, we can use it to talk about something in the present which is impossible, because it's not true.

(I don't have his number now, so it's impossible for me to call him).


- **If I spoke** good English, I'd have a good job.

Third conditional

It talks about the past.
It's used to describe a situation that
didn't happen, and to imagine the result
of this situation.



- **If she had studied,**
she would have passed the exam.

- **If I hadn't eaten so much,**
I wouldn't have felt sick.

- **If we had taken a taxi,**
we wouldn't have missed the train.





- She **wouldn't have been** tired
if she had gone to bed earlier
- She **would have become** a teacher **if** she had
gone to university
- He **would have been** on time for
the interview **if** he had left the house at nine





Second

if + past simple, ...would + infinitive

Third

if + past perfect, ...would + have + past participle
