Gerunds are words that are formed
with verbs but act as nouns. They're
very easy to spot, since every gerund
is a verb with **ing** tacked to its tail.

Gerund vs Progressive form



He likes **reading** books.

He **is reading** a book.

After **reading** the book, he went to bed.

He **was reading** a book.

Gerund vs Progressive form



I enjoy **playing** chess.

I **am playing** chess with my friends.

She can't live without **drinking** coffee.

She **was drinking** coffee the whole day.

Few examples

She is considering **buying** a new house.

They finished **working** in the garden.

They keep on **running**.

I don't mind **sleeping** on the couch.
