We can use mixed conditionals when we imagine a past change with a result in the present or a present change with a result in the past.

1. Mixed
Past/Present



- *If I hadn't got the job in Tokyo,
I wouldn't be live in my current city.*

Imagining how a change in a past situation
would have a result in the present.



2. Mixed Present/Past



- *If I didn't have so much work this week, I would have gone with you yesterday.*

Imagining how a different situation in the present would mean that the past was different as well.



Examples

- *If I'd planted seeds in spring, I would have tomatoes now.*
- *If she hadn't missed that flight, she would be here at the event.*

Examples

- They really don't think they know about this. If they did, she would have lost her job months ago.
- If I had more money, I would have gone to France.

Structure



1. **Past/present**

If + past perfect, would + infinitive.

2. **Present / Past**

If + past simple, would have + past participle.
